

A unique series will be published, having a common series title.

An editorial board (EB) will be set-up, composed by five editors' in chief:

- Prof. Vincenzo Bianco,
- Prof. Ruben Aghgashayan from NPUA,
- Prof. Alen Amirkanyan from AUA,
- Prof. Vladimir Alekhin from URFU,
- Prof. Marina Shitikova from VSUACE.

The project coordinator participates to the meetings of the EB.

The recognition to the "UMO" scientific association will be requested for the Russian party. Similar recognition will be obtained for the Armenian party. This recognition will be quoted on the covers of the books.

The books, in A5 format, could have a dimension of about 150 – 200 pages each and published with regular ISBN.

The EB will work on-line.

First task of the EB is to identify the eight texts, in addition to the Glossary, to choose among the core modules of the different Master programmes.

For each text, an editor will be appointed by the EB. The EB will decide autonomously on the distribution of the texts among the different Master programmes.

The appointed editor will have the task to collect all the contributions by teachers / staff from the interested consortium members.

Since it is considered as evidence of added-value the active participation to the texts preparation from each member, it is mandatory requirement at least one contribution, for each text, from the two parties (Member States and Partner Countries).

As for the responsibility and the titles, the EB will take the decision after the proposals submitted by each PC University.

As results of the meeting in Yerevan, there are the following preliminary suggestions / proposals:

In general, the majority of texts' coordination has to be appointed to the Partner Countries' party, in order to enhance their awareness on the process of curricula reform. In any case, there will be the involvement and contribution from the Member States partners.

Keeping into due consideration the needs to fulfil the tasks in order to have the material availability of the texts for the beginning of the Master course academic year (September 2017), the following time planning is agreed:

by 31 October 2016	Definition of titles and editor for each of the nine textbooks.
by 30 November 2016	Final decision on the structure of the textbooks, including the chapters and authors.
by 31 May 2017	Collection of the edited material in Armenian, Russian or English language.
by 31 May 2017	Fulfilment of the contract procedures by NPUA and URFU with the Armenian and Russian providers.
By 31 August 2017	Delivery of the 300 copies for each of the nine texts by the providers
